TIPS FOR TALKING TO YOUR DOCTOR ABOUT



Lowering bad cholesterol can feel like a never-ending cycle.

When you've tried diet, exercise, and a statin, and your bad cholesterol is still too high, adding NEXLETOL may help if you have known heart disease or an inherited condition that causes high levels of bad cholesterol.

Start a conversation with your doctor by asking the questions in this guide. You can print it, fill it out, and bring it with you to your next appointment.

What are NEXLETOL and NEXLIZET?

NEXLETOL and NEXLIZET are prescription medicines used, along with diet and other lipid-lowering medicines, in the treatment of adults who need additional lowering of "bad" cholesterol (LDL-C) and have:

- heterozygous familial hypercholesterolemia (HeFH), an inherited condition that causes high levels of LDL-C, and/or
- known cardiovascular disease due to high levels of bad cholesterol

The active ingredient in NEXLETOL is bempedoic acid. The active ingredients in NEXLIZET are bempedoic acid and ezetimibe.

It is not known if NEXLETOL or NEXLIZET can decrease problems related to high cholesterol, such as heart attacks or stroke.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

Who should not take NEXLETOL or NEXLIZET?

There are no contraindications for NEXLETOL.

Do not take NEXLIZET if you are allergic to ezetimibe tablets. Ezetimibe, one of the ingredients in NEXLIZET, can cause serious allergic reactions. Stop taking NEXLIZET and call your doctor, or go to the nearest emergency room, if you have the following:

- swelling of your face, lips, mouth, or tongue
- wheezing or trouble breathing
- severe itching and/or skin rashes, redness, or swelling
- dizziness or fainting
- fast heartbeat or pounding in your chest

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION (cont.)

What should I tell my doctor before taking NEXLETOL or NEXLIZET (bempedoic acid and ezetimibe)?

For NEXLETOL and NEXLIZET, tell your doctor if you:

- have, or have ever had, gout
- have, or have ever had, tendon problems
- are pregnant or breastfeeding, or may become pregnant or plan to breastfeed
- have severe kidney or liver problems
- are taking simvastatin or pravastatin

For NEXLIZET, please also tell your doctor if you:

- have ever had an allergic reaction to ezetimibe
- have moderate or severe liver problems
- are taking cyclosporine, fibrates, or cholestyramine

What is the most important safety information I should know about **NEXLETOL and NEXLIZET?**

NEXLETOL and NEXLIZET can cause side effects that can become serious, including:

- high levels of uric acid in the blood, which can lead to gout, a painful joint condition. Call your doctor if you have any of the following symptoms:
- severe foot pain, especially in the toe joint
- warm joints
- swelling
- tender joints
- joint redness
- tendon problems: Stop taking NEXLETOL or NEXLIZET immediately and get medical help right away if you get any of the following signs or symptoms of tendon rupture:
- hear or feel a snap or pop in a tendon area
- bruising right after an injury in a tendon area
- unable to move the affected area or put weight on the affected area

What are the common side effects of NEXLETOL and NEXLIZET?

Tell your doctor right away about any side effect you experience. NEXLETOL and NEXLIZET can cause side effects, including:

- symptoms of the common cold or flu
- bronchitis
- - pain in the shoulders, legs, or arms
- muscle spasms
- diarrhea
- back pain
- stomach pain
- fatigue

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION (cont.)

Your doctor may check your blood for side effects that you might not be able to feel.

These are not all the possible side effects of NEXLETOL and NEXLIZET. For more information, ask your doctor or pharmacist.

What forms do NEXLETOL and NEXLIZET come in?

NEXLETOL and NEXLIZET are tablets that you take by mouth. NEXLETOL contains 180 mg of bempedoic acid, and NEXLIZET contains 180 mg of bempedoic acid and 10 mg of ezetimibe.

Can I take NEXLETOL or NEXLIZET with other medicines?

Tell your doctor about all the medicines you take, including both prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. Before taking NEXLETOL or NEXLIZET, tell your doctor if you take, or plan to take:

• simvastatin or pravastatin (other cholesterol-lowering medicines). Your doctor may change the dose for these medicines if taking them with NEXLETOL or NEXLIZET

Before taking NEXLIZET, please also tell your doctor if you take, or plan to take:

- cyclosporine (often used in organ transplant patients)
- fibrates (other cholesterol-lowering medicines)
- cholestyramine (another cholesterol-lowering medicine)
